IMPACT REPORT

Despite ongoing challenges with the pandemic, KID Museum has continued to bring meaningful maker learning to kids, families, and the broader community. We've expanded program offerings to reach more students, providing in-person, hands-on experiences at our Davis Library site, the Universities at Shady Grove, and at schools across the region.

From July through January, we tripled the number of elementary and middle school students served through our partnership programs with Montgomery County Public Schools, prioritizing those students hardest hit by the pandemic. We also opened our doors to offer in-person camps, after-school workshops, and school-day-off programs to the community.

In the coming months, we will be making an exciting leap to serve even more kids, educators, families, and the community at large, with the opening of our new flagship location in downtown Bethesda, Maryland.
